# CU Buffs' host Hawaii Saturday

BOULDER — Hawaii can joke that perhaps it ought to be included in the Pac-12 Conference standings.

The Rainbow Warriors are football members of the Mountain West. But on Saturday afternoon at Folsom Field, Colorado (1-2, 0-1 Pac-12) will become the third Pac-12 team to face Hawaii this season.

That gives CU coach Mike MacIntyre a familiar gauge while analyzing Hawaii's game film. And also a cause for concern.

Judging by how competitive Hawaii was against Washington and Oregon State, the Rainbow Warriors appear to be much improved after having gone 1-11 a season ago.

Hawaii (1-2) lost 17-16 to then-No. 25 Washington in its season opener and fell 38-30 to Oregon State the next week. Colorado hasn't come that close to defeating Pac-12 opponents in back-to-back weeks since joining the league in 2011.

CU is a seven-point favorite and showed encouraging signs last weekend during a 38-24 home loss to Arizona State. Scoring drives of 77, 77 and 99 yards produced the three touchdowns.

"This will be a very, very tough game," MacIntyre said Tuesday.

Against Washington, Hawaii took a 10-0 lead before the Huskies scored 17 unanswered points. Seven days later, Oregon State appeared in control with a 38-7 lead, but the Rainbow Warriors scored the final 23 points.

"They're a tough team that keeps fighting, keeps competing," CU quarterback Sefo Liufau said. "We're going to have to

play a four-quarter game."

"They're very physical," MacIntyre said. "Their quarterback (Ikaika Woolsey) is extremely athletic. They've got big, big wide receivers. Defensively, they're very active and bring a lot of different types of blitzes."

On Colorado's side, the big question is whether the Buffs can build off its effort last week against a ranked team. That didn't happen a season ago whenever Mac Intrye thought his team had make strides.

"I see more of a 24-hour, 365-day-a-year mentality, which means you're more invested," MacIntyre said. "When you're more invested, it's harder to give it up. When you're more invested, you're more precise. You study more. It means more to you. You're more focused. I see us taking more steps in the right direction."


